Projects

SHAREAfrica's objectives are met through projects defined and administered through in-country initiatives. Each project is agreed and sponsored by SHAREAfrica and SHARE (in-country) organisations. The funding for each project will vary depending upon need and provisions. The organisations will allocate and share resources according to priorities set by the Trustees. Projects are reported in SHAREAfrica's news bulletins and will be available through SHAREAfrica's website (www.shareafrica.com) and other means.



What SHAREAfrica is NOT !

SHAREAfrica is not a missionary charity but works in cooperation with such charities. SHAREAfrica is not directly involved in missionary work such as evangelisation and church planting, but works together with local assemblies providing complimentary support within the communities. SHAREAfrica is not directly involved in medical work but will support any project that encompasses the overall objective of poverty reduction and sustainable development.

S SHARE's in-country representatives will identify the supplies and services necessary to meet the needs of local communities. Project requirements and justification, including cost estimates are prepared for all major programs. Funding is provided by a combination of

contributions and donations as well as from other in-country initiatives.

H **HELP:** A board of Trustees are responsible for the general control & management of the charity in line with the charities statement of governance and in accordance with the Trustees Act 2000 (England and Wales). Volunteers from various sources devote their time and energy to assist the organisation meet the vital material needs of fellow Christians and others.

A **ASSESSMENT:** On the ground assessment of the effectiveness of the operation is monitored by responsible individuals who understand the various constraints and commitments associated with each project. Assessment is communicated back through the infrastructure so the organisation can respond to situations as they arise. Close liaison with SHAREAfrica's in-country partner provides a mechanism for continually improving the process through lessons learned and responding to feedback from people on the ground.

R **REPORTING** ensures accountability through fair factual publication of results. This is done through press reports, financial reports, websites and news bulletins. The organisation's success depends upon good communications, keeping people well informed of local conditions and encouraging donors to support the project's objectives. Evidence of how the goods and services are meeting the identified needs will be reported by local representatives.

E **EXCHANGE:** the ultimate aim is to develop economic and spiritual growth by equipping people to produce and trade commodities while at the same time upholding a Christian work ethic that is recognized and respected within the community. This will provide a crucial source of income through national and foreign partnerships resulting in sustained growth.
